Sometimes just switching out a few glasses of soda for water, or making sure to drink a small glass of water once an hour throughout the day, can make all the difference in the world to our health and well-being. # THE CORNER OFFICE

A word from Bob Dwyer, Jr.



Many people complained their air conditioners just couldn't keep up when the outdoor temperatures reached the high 90s and 100s. People would call and say HELP I have my thermostat set at 72 and its 80 in my house I NEED HELP NOW!

#### Let's have some fun and take a test.

See if you can pick the correct answer:

The outdoor temperature is 101 degrees. Its 3pm and you're headed home from work, the sun is shining but you're not worried because this morning you set your thermostat to 72 degrees. You get home and realize the indoor temperature isn't what you thought it would be! Its 78 degrees in the house and the air conditioner just keeps running. Which of the following three options is the most likely scenario?

> The air conditioner is too small.

The air conditioner is leaking refrigerant.

The air conditioner is working perfect.

### Did your air conditioner keep up in the hot wather?

pick? The correct answer is The air conditioner is working perfect.

Ok, now you're probably grunting with disbelief but let me explain. When your contractor sized the single stage air conditioner for your home he should have used a scientific calculation based on Manuel J load calculations. There are many steps to this calculation but one of the factors is average or normal outdoor temperatures in the area your home is located. Let's use Goshen for an example. The average outdoor summer design temperature for Goshen is 89 degrees and the indoor design temperature is 75 degrees. That means the air conditioner should keep the house 75 inside if it's 89 outside. When the outdoor temperature raises well above the design temperature like it did last week you will experience higher temperatures inside the home.

I know, you're probably thinking why not size for 100 degrees or just use a bigger air conditioner? If your contractor did that you would have a real problem like an air conditioner that cycles too much, higher utility bills, too much humidity creating an uncomfortable home and possible mold problems just to mention a few things. Remember, your unit was sized for average (normal) temperatures - not for 100 degree temperatures. Do you want your system to work the best most of the time or just

Which answer did you a few days when the temperatures may get much higher than normal?

> If you're not sure if your air conditioner is sized correctly call a heating & air conditioning contractor and ask him if he can supply you with a written load calculation for your home.

> A few Tips: Heat always travels to cold. The heat outdoors will penetrate your home to get to the cooler conditioned air in the summer. Keep the heat out by keeping blinds down or closed, try not to cook or do things to create more heat indoors and try not to run in and out of the house repeatedly ... all of these things will cause your equipment to work even harder to keep up.

> Did you know you can get pictures of your home that will show you where the heat penetrates your home? Ask me how

> There are some air conditioners that are designed to work at different loads - they can change cooling capacity and work efficiently in different temperature extremes; you may want to consider this type of system to keep you comfortable in all scenarios.


### DIRECTIONS



3. To serve, spoon portions of the turkey mixture into lettuce leaves, top with herbs and carrot and roll into wraps.



# **THE UNKOWN RESTAURANT CRITIC**

Elkhart County is blessed with many fine restaurants, so my wife and I have taken it upon ourselves to visit as many as possible and report our findings to you. It's a rough job but someone has to do it. The restaurants do not know who we are and are not notified prior to a visit so that we can get an authentic experience of their hospitality, food and surroundings.

The first restaurant we visited was Lucchese's, located at 655 County Road 17, in Elkhart. It is in a shopping center and has plenty of parking conveniently located in front of the establishment. When coming from the south it is difficult getting into the parking lot because of the restricted entrance directly out front. We recommend turning west at the stop light on the south end of the shopping center to get easier access and avoid the goofy front entrance. The décor of the restaurant is pleasant and not overdone. It is clean and well organized. Tables and booths are both available depending on your mood. Linen napkins add a touch of class that is appreciated and there is a fine list of wines for those who are connoisseurs. The waiters and waitresses were very attentive and made us feel welcome. This is a restaurant that lets its food do its talking.

I ordered the Chicken Marsalla and my wife ordered the Spinach and Mushroom Lasagna. The chicken was so tender that a fork could cut it and it was served on a bed of pasta along with mushrooms and in a sauce that was exceptional. The Lasagna was worth writing home about, with a homemade flavor that made you want more. All this was served with complimentary Italian bread that we could dip in Olive oil and spices.

After dinner we had coffee and were presented with a

#### choice of desserts. We shared a piece of Turtle Cheese cake that was drizzled with chocolate and whip cream on the side. We are looking forward to having another piece some day.

The only disappointment was the Italian dressing on a tossed salad. It was bland and had little taste which is surprising in a restaurant specializing in Italian food.
