



## The Corner ASKANATTORNEY!

As a community service, we have been asked to offer this forum for you, our readers to submit legal questions or concerns that you may have. Please get your questions in no later than the 2nd Monday of every month.

#### Do I need a will?

We can't determine to be born or when we die, but we can determine what we do during our life, and what will happen to our possessions after death.

A will is one way to make your wishes known concerning the distribution of your estate. Also you can choose the guardian for your minor children. You can make specific gifts as well as to name the administrators of your estate. There are steps you can take so you will not need a will and you should check with an attorney to make sure you have adequately covered all areas.

## I found a form on the internet, will this be good when I die?

Most of the internet forms and documents are generic and Indiana has some specific requirements for a will to be valid, and you should check with an attorney to see if all the requirements have been met.

A representative of a Law Firm (not an attorney) and an Insurance man came to see me and I signed my will with him, is this valid?

This is something that has been happening in the Mid-

dlebury/Shipshewana area. The problem with signing a will and not speaking with an attorney, is that you do not know if you have been given the proper legal advice. Also if you want to change your will then you will need to talk to an attorney.

All these papers from the man who arrived at your home may or may not be valid, but why not seek out someone who lives in your community.

If you have signed up with someone you don't know, go to a local attorney and make sure everything is in order.

The same applies to insurance and investments.






