


THE MIRACLE RIGHT BEFORE OUR EYES -By Brenda Duryer


From The Pulpit


Attention: Local Clergymen/women:

The Corner Office:

A word from Bob Dwyer, Jr.

Someone asked me the other day, "what makes your company special?" "What makes you different than other companies?" In a stern voice they went on to tell me that we can't be any different than anyone else. This person was a little upset because they wanted to purchase a new furnace from me but my price was higher than the other guy who was going to do "the exact same thing".

After thinking about this for a moment I asked the potential customer why they just don't hire the other guy if they really believe they do the exact same thing for less money. That person looked me straight in the eye then said "just do the job".

I wanted to share with

you a few facts that I shared with this customer:

According to the Department of Energy (DOE) the typical duct system loses up to 40 percent of the energy put out by the central furnace or heat pump. In case you don't understand that let me try to be more precise ... the term "typical" used here is what you should expect. More than likely it is what you probably have in your home now. That system even if it's brand new looses up to 40% of its mass before it ever makes it to your registers!

Now relate that to your cash would you just throw away 40% of your money? (Or 40 cents out of every dollar)

test and document duct leakage. The other company said they did too but when questioned further by the customer it turned out they actually couldn't document it because they didn't have the necessary tools to measure with but they could talk about it.



From Our Kitchen

Gourmet Pretzel Rods

Ingredients:

1 (14 ounce) package individually wrapped caramels, unwrapped 1 tablespoon water 15 pretzel rods 1/2 (14 ounce) package candy-coated chocolate pieces 1 1/2 cups chopped peanuts

Directions:

In a microwave safe dish, combine caramels and water. Microwave for 2 to 2 1/2 minutes or until smooth, stirring after each minute. Dip a pretzel rod into melted caramel. Reserve about an inch at the end to use as a handle, and spread smooth with a spatula or the back of a spoon. Attach 12 chocolate pieces, then roll in chopped peanuts. Place on wax paper until set. **FOOTNOTE:**

If caramel becomes difficult to work with about halfway through dipping, you can add 1/2 teaspoon water, and microwave for another 30 seconds; but don't keep microwaving or the caramel gets ruined. You may use candy making white or milk chocolate ... melt according to package directions then dip pretzels as they are or you can dip them in the caramel first then the candied chocolate ... garnish with any sprinkles or candy coatings you wish or drizzle them with melted candied chocolate.




